HISTORY

Imperial Shrine Association Miami, Florida-November 1928

One hundred thousand Shriners converged on Miami, Florida via special trains, steam ships, motor cars and even airplanes for the Annual Imperial Shrine Convention. These nobles are representing the more than 600,000 Shriners, from 157 temples, throughout Canada, US, Mexico, the Hawaiian Islands, and the Panama Canal Zone. They are all there to celebrate and welcome Illustrious Sir Frank Cameron Jones of Houston, Tea as the newly installed Imperial Potentate of the Ancient Arabic Order of the Noble of the Mystic Shrine. The city of Miami has made every effort to see that the visiting nobles and their ladies will have a time to remember.

Nobles arriving by ship will be greeted by registration stations on the dock. Thirty to sixty typists have been hired to process the nobles as they arrive. Two hundred thousand registrations cards will be prepared for nobles and ladies. Also, a complete list of noble's locations will be arranged so that cables, radiograms, or telegrams can be delivered to them.

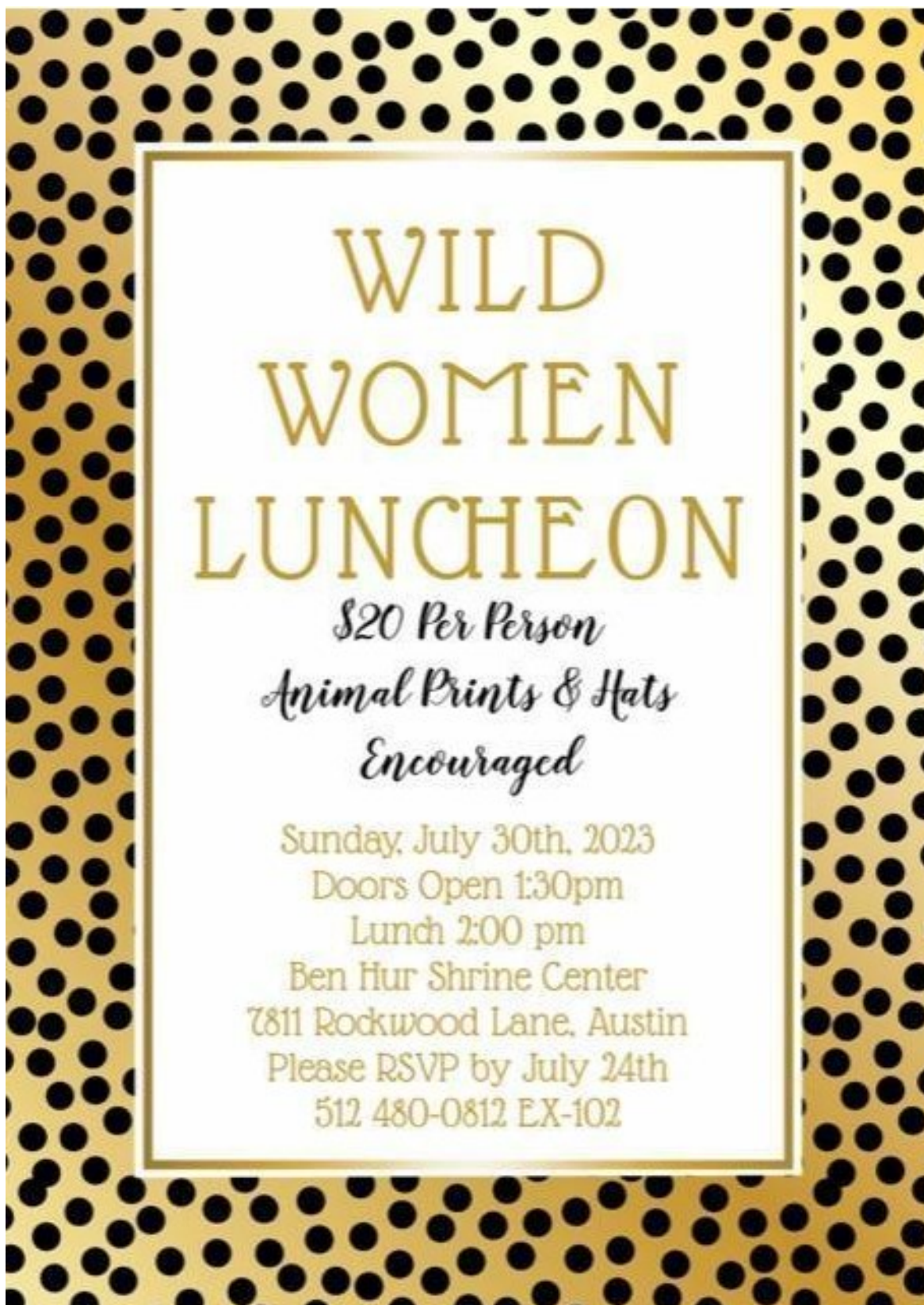
World famous aviator William S. Brock flew the Detroit delegation to Miami in a specially built biplane. The delegation was welcomed by the Director Aviation for Miami and other civic officials.

Excursions are planned to Key West and Havana, Cuba on steamships. The response has been so great that arrangements have been made for transport by aero plane to the same locations. Miamians with motor cars have volunteered to transport visiting Shriners on sightseeing junkets or any other needs as they may be. All parking restrictions in Miami have been rescinded for the duration of the convention. The other 600 members from Detroit arrived by special train. Some Shriners arriving by train had to have special berth accommodations. Noble Robert Keenan, at seven and one-half feet in height, required two berths while Noble Albert Albinger needed an extra berth to accommodate his ample girth at 414 pounds. They were the tallest and heaviest Shriners at the convention.

Beginning in May 1928, a Brooklyn firm began construction of a machine that would create an artificial Aurora Borealis (Northern Lights) specially for the shrine convention in Miami. The device consists of a 62-inch-high intensity search light that casts a light beam of one and half billion candlepower. The flow of the lights is controlled by motor driven prisms which break the light into seven beams. The colors are controlled by passing the light through lenses of various hues. The entire apparatus will weigh five tons.

All that fun and hospitality has to have a wet blanket in the crowd. The Miami Herald posted a notice of (Shriners Beware! The Goblins will get you if You Don't Watch Out). Seems like the Government was sending in two hundred prohibition and customs officers to concentrate on the Miami area with orders to clean up liquor establishments both large and small. No reports on what effect they had.

The new shrine organization was doing a rushing business initiating new members at the "official stable". The organization is the "Camel Herders" and is recognized by the Imperial Divan with all proceeds going to the hospital Fund.

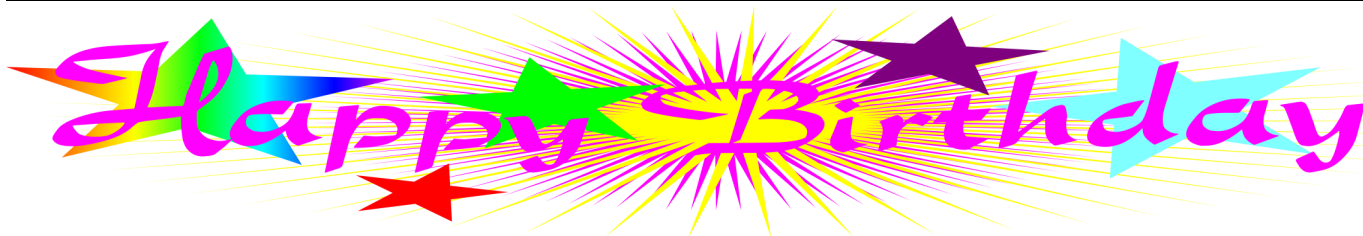
