












BEN HUR SHRINE SHOTGUN UNIT

BEN HUR SHRINER SETS WORLD SKYDIVING RECORD AT 107

When Al Blaschke was ninety-seven years old, he was asked by his friend Betty Schleder, also a Sun City resident, if he would like to jump out of an airplane. Al's response was he would like to do that, but he wanted to wait until his one hundredth birthday. Well, true to his word Al did a tandem parachute jump from 10,000 feet to closely tie the world's record for the oldest person to jump out of an airplane. Al also said that he would do it again when he was one hundred and three to celebrate his two grandsons' graduations from college. While Al was happy about setting the world record but said he was more excited about spending the day with his grandsons.

Not too long after his historic record setting jump, Brother Blaschke had an occasion to visit with Governor Greg Abbot at Betty Schleder's home in Sun City. During their visit they spoke of Al Blaschke's accomplishments and setting a Guinness World Record. At the end of the visit, Governor Abbott said "I'll jump with you Mr. Blaschke". And he did. On November 27, 2023, after weather and scheduling delays, the dynamic duo of Shriner Al Blaschke and Texas Governor Greg Abbott boarded a twin-engine airplane and completed their buddy jump. Witnesses were on hand to verify the event for the Guinness World Record.

Al was born in Janesville, Wisconsin on January 4, 1917. He spent his working life as a craftsman in the tool and die trade. His skills as a tool and die maker were much more valuable to the US war effort than as a soldier. During WWII he helped manufacture airplane parts for the war effort. Al and his wife Eleanor retired to Arizona but later moved to Sun City in Georgetown to watch his grandsons grow up.

Brother Blaschke became a member of Lodge 307, Brookfield, Wisconsin in 1939. He received his fifty year service award in 1990 and the seventy-five-year award in 2015. He affiliated with Ben Hur Shrine in 2005 and is an avid golfer. At a stated Ben Hur Shrine meeting in the past year, Brother Blaschke excused himself early because he needed to get back home to Georgetown. Someone asked if he needed to go to bed

early to which he replied, "I need to because I

have an 8:00 AM Tee Time".

What's next for Brother Al? Is there a seat on the Space X shuttle? A touch and go moon landing?
