PER-CAPITA INCREASE PASSES AT IMPERIAL SESSION

Per Capita will increase by \$20 effective August 1, 2023. August 1st is the day each year when dues and assessments are posted. All dues and assessments for 2024 should be paid prior the then end of 2023. Per Capita is now \$50 per year, an increase of \$20.

If you wish to become a Life Per Capita Member, you have the option of making a one time payment that is 30 times the Per Capita Rate. (30 x \$50.00 = \$1500) Full Life Member varies according to age. The chart is on page 14.






HISTORY

Imperial Potentate Visits Ben Hur and Applauds Their Efforts in The War

(1942)

Imperial Potentate Thomas Law of Atlanta, Georgia said that Shriners are doing their part to promote patriotism and an offensive instead of defensive attitude over the United States. Law said that while traveling the country he has seen places where there is too much complacency. While he does not name any of those places out of concern of being drawn into a controversy that some citizens seem to think of the war as being in foreign country. They need to realize that it is something that must be won.

Imperial Sir reports that 310,000 Shriners in North America are doing their part in the war effort. He said that Shriners all over the United States were sponsoring patriotic rallies, organizing home guard units and taking an active part in Savings Bond program. Along the coastal areas Shriners are serving guard duty. Have toured the state he was impressed with the fact that harbors, bridges and dams were carefully guarded.

The offensive attitude of Texans with their shipyards, oil industry, synthetic rubber plants and other rapidly growing industries will play a large role in winning the war.

While in Austin, the Imperial Sir toured the highland lakes with Potentate Thomas Green and Galloway Calhoun, Imperial Second Ceremonial Master. He commented favorably on these impressive projects that had been completed in the so recent past.

As a finale to his visit, Imperial Sir visited the Scottish Rite Dorm and Ben Hur Shrine Temple. The day culminated with a formal ball at the Stephen F. Austin Hotel.
